Some schools in the UK are starting to ban smartphones during the school day. For example, Thomas Mills High School in England recently introduced a new rule. Students aged 11 to 16 must now lock away their phones from the moment they arrive until the school day ends. The headmaster believes **this rule** helps students concentrate better and improves their mental well-being.

Supporters of phones bans think that smartphones in schools are a big distraction. Students may be tempted to check social media, send messages, or play games during lessons. Studies also show that too much phone use can lead to anxiety and depression, especially in young people. Many believe that removing phones from the school environment helps students focus more and reduces harmful online behavior like cyberbullying. A recent survey found that nearly half of British adults support banning smartphones in schools.

However, not everyone agrees with the idea of banning phones completely. Some people believe that smartphones can actually help students learn. They can be useful for research, reading, and using educational apps. Instead of banning **them**, some experts suggest that schools should teach students how to use their phones in a responsible and smart way. By setting clear rules and using phones for the right reasons, technology could become a helpful part of learning.

The question of whether smartphones should be banned in schools has no simple answer. While banning them may help improve focus and reduce stress, others believe that learning to use smartphones properly is a better solution.
